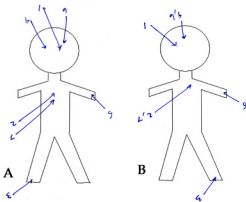
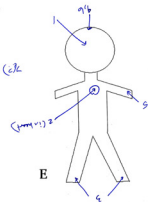
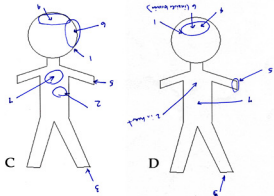


Both Soul and Feelings Centrally Placed



Figures A and B, by children ages 10 and 10 respectively, have the "soul" (indicated by "7") and "feelings" (indicated by "2") both placed at the center of the body. In figure B, the child specifically indicated that the two were in the same place.

Figures C and D, to the right, were done by children ages 10 and 9 respectively. They are similar to figures A and B above in that both the "soul" and the "feelings" have been placed at the center of the body. However, with these examples, the children specifically indicated placement of each item in either the heart region or more centrally. The placement of the "soul" and "feelings" in figure C is opposite that of figure D.



For Figure E (left) the child (age 9) has placed the "feelings" in the heart of the person, similar to figure D, and in general to A, B, and C as well. The difference here is that this child denied knowledge of the placement of the "soul."

This group of children represent the opposite of those that separate the "soul" and "feelings" from one another. Specifically, with the exception of the child which yielded figure E, these children have a distinct sense of connection with the "soul" and the "feelings." This might indicate a more "spiritual" rather than "rational" approach to mind theory.
